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## About Us

The **Center for Alzheimer Research and Treatment (CART)** is part of the **Alzheimer's Center** at Brigham & Women's Hospital, along with the Center for Brain/Mind Medicine. CART is also affiliated with the Massachusetts Alzheimer's Disease Research Center (MADRC) and Harvard Medical School.



Our mission is to:

- Assess promising new treatments for Alzheimer's disease through clinical trials.
- Improve early diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease by employing more sensitive clinical evaluations, biological markers, and neuroimaging techniques.
- Educate the next generation of clinicians and researchers, as well as provide information and resources to the community.

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## We Need Your Help

Alzheimer's disease strips away our most human qualities—memory, personality, reasoning and language—eventually preventing one's ability to perform the simplest every day activities. In the United States alone, more than 5 million people suffer from Alzheimer's disease and this number is projected to grow to 7 million by 2025.

**The first person to be cured of Alzheimer's disease will be a clinical trial participant!**

Research participation is critical to finding a cure. We are looking for healthy volunteers who are cognitively normal, people concerned about their memory and thinking, and people diagnosed with mild cognitive impairment (MCI) or early Alzheimer's disease (AD) to participate in research. Most studies are for individuals 50 and older. **Call us at (617) 723-8085.**

### **Is driving into Boston holding you back?**

Most of our studies offer a car service for our participants. We also have a travel fund to reduce driving as a barrier to research participation. At CART, we aim to make sure everyone has access to participate.

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## We Need Your Help

People participate in research for a variety of reasons. Healthy volunteers and people living the disease say they participate in clinical trials to help others, contribute to moving the science forward, or receive access to a possible new treatment.



At CART, we conduct two major types of clinical research studies:

- **Therapeutic Clinical Trials—** Participants may receive an experimental treatment to test new potential therapies.
- **Observational Studies—** Participants undergo memory and thinking tests as well as brain imaging scans.
