Updates for our collaborators

This newsletter serves to provide you with information about our programs, recent medical research field news and services our centers can offer to you, your patients and families.

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Adapting to Coronavirus and Re-opening Research Operations:

The Massachusetts Alzheimer's Disease Research Center ([MADRC](#)) and affiliated groups have continued their important work during the COVID-19 pandemic. Our study sites quickly adapted and utilized technology to move forward with virtual remote research participant visits and data collection. Clinical teams at the Massachusetts General Hospital and Brigham and Women's Hospital continued to perform both virtual and in-person patient visits during this unprecedented time. We are very proud of our staff, many of whom were temporarily re-assigned to support inpatient COVID-19 medical services.

As Massachusetts entered Phase Three of Reopening in July, some MADRC-affiliated research groups resumed in-person visits, on a limited basis, while some continue virtual visits.

The Brigham & Women's Hospital Center for Alzheimer Research and Treatment ([CART](#)) resumed on site visits in July on a limited basis. Staff are eager to welcome back participants and study partners of ongoing clinical trials and are taking precautions to keep everyone safe, including: wearing masks; limiting the number and duration of exposures; screening staff and participants and study partners for COVID-19 symptoms 24-72 hours prior to visits; and sanitizing exam and testing rooms before and after every visit. Research Participation Opportunities

MADRC-affiliated research sites continue to actively pre-screen for studies in anticipation of bringing in participants for new studies later this summer and fall. We have several studies available for older adults with preclinical Alzheimer's disease, mild cognitive impairment and mild Alzheimer's disease dementia:

The [AHEAD Study](#) which seeks cognitively normal adults ages 55-80 who may be at increased risk of memory loss associated with Alzheimer's disease, will begin enrolling soon at the BWH Center for Alzheimer Research and Treatment. This is the first Alzheimer's disease prevention trial to enroll people as young as 55 years old.

Rapid Diagnostic Clinic

A unique program located at CART in collaboration with the Center for Brain/Mind Medicine ([CBMM](#)) offers a one-time clinical visit for diagnostic support and access to research opportunities. This is in addition to the standard resources offered at our center. The second opinion, one-time visit is billable to insurance and conducted in our rapid diagnostic clinic setting. A highly trained physician assistant and a behavioral neurologist will work with you, your patient and their family to provide this diagnostic support.
