Massachusetts General Hospital ADRC Research Education Component (REC) 2023-2024



Overview

This one-year program based in the Massachusetts Alzheimer's Disease Research Center (MADRC) at Mass General Hospital is designed for early career investigators (e.g., as a supplement to a fellowship or K award) or those new to Alzheimer's disease and related dementia (ADRD) research across the Harvard community. It includes targeted mentorship across clinical, quantitative, and basic science; a multi-disciplinary lecture series in dementia; specialized training placements; opportunities to observe clinical and research visits, consensus conferences, community events, and other Center activities; and networking and speaking opportunities. Our goal is to support the career development of investigators with deep and broad knowledge of dementia and a rich network of peer and senior colleagues in the field.
